A new theory that's not so new.

If most of us forget what a wheel looks like and then someone reinvents it, the "new" idea may seem absolutely revolutionary. This seems to be happening right now with what some scientists are describing as "the organizing principle of all life". It's a revolutionary new theory that says that all living entities, from single cells to human beings, are driven by the same imperative, which is to reduce the difference between our expectations and what sensory inputs tell us is actually happening. This theory, known as Active Inference, is being touted as the most important organizing principle for the biosphere since Darwin's theory of evolution.

It seemed familiar when I read about it, and after some thought I dug this out: "When you make the two into one, and when you make the inner like the outer and the outer like the inner, and the upper like the lower, and when you make male and female into a single one, so that the male will not be male nor the female be female, when you make eyes in place of an eye, a hand in place of a hand, a foot in place of a foot, an image in place of an image, then you will enter (the kingdom)"

That's a quotation from Jesus in the Gospel of Thomas -- suppressed as heretical, lost for 1800 years, and finally a copy was discovered in ancient storage jar, which was dug up by a farmer in Egypt in 1945. Seems clear enough that Jesus is telling us to align our perspectives so there is verisimilitude between our subjective mental images of our own bodies & our mental models of the world, on the one hand, and the objective reality of what we are & what God has created all around us, on the other. So did Jesus have Active Inference in mind? And how about the scientists....were they studying non-canonical early Christian texts? Probably not! Seems like another case of rediscovering the wheel.

Liz Bradbury has been a full-time advocate for the LGBT community since 1994 and an organizer since 1979. In 2004, she co-founded PA Diversity Network, where she served as Executive Director for ten years. She helped lead successful efforts to pass model LGBT-inclusive non-discrimination and domestic partner legislation in nine PA municipalities. She served for 15 years on the Human Relations Commission of the City of Allentown (including three years as Chair) where she wrote the guidelines for discrimination investigations and trained investigators.
