Living Beyond Amid

Finding ways each day to create space for meditation and prayer is a continuing challenge for me. Recently, I start the day with the book, *Meditations: On the Monk Who Dwells in Daily Life* by Thomas Moore. Here is a sample of one favorite:

"God is beyond in the midst of our life, says Bonhoeffer. The monk manages to live this beyond-amid with special gracefulness and beauty. Beauty emerges only when life has achieved radical beyondness while fully amid, or intense amidness by means of beyond. He withdraws in order to be more involved. We average persons may need daily withdrawal in order to be more fully participants in community, family and society. Pull up the cowl, eat in silence, read to be absorbed, pray without intent, chant."

These words speak to my condition as a Friend on my role in meeting for worship, my involvement in the life of the meeting and my daily struggle to live a spirit-led life. In meeting for worship, the process of centering and expectant waiting for the Spirit can also be described as the process of achieving radical beyondness while fully amid. Unlike those who practice traditions of individual meditation, Friends seek to be gathered as a community with God in the midst of our life, our worship. We know the beauty of a gathered or covered meeting when we feel that we are one in the Spirit.

"To withdraw in the fullness of community" is what I do each first day in Meeting for Worship when I leave behind my daily struggles in order to find refuge and time for

reflection with others who share this need. Finding the fullness of community, however, also means finding a place to offer my gifts of ministry and to accept those from others. God leads us to this spiritual place so that we can receive the blessings we need and so that we can find our unique voice and call to service.

When I enter the Meeting room on First Day, I have learned that the quality of my experience in this hour is directly related to how well I've done the past week in achieving radical beyondness while fully amid. Starting each day with centering prayer helps me move with more grace and deliberate speed, to respond from a place of love rather than anger or pain, and to feel that I am living beyond-amid. The daily struggle is also teaching me to heed the advice that the poet Rilke gave in his *Letters to a Young Poet*. I must learn to live with the questions until I have lived my way to the answers.

Lessons in how to practice centering for worship sometime come from unexpected sources. One Sunday a young woman introduced herself at rise of meeting as a first time attender and thanked us for creating a place that is about being rather than doing. I was so glad that she understood intuitively what we hope for and was reminded of the instructions of my favorite Friendly guide, Issac Pennington: "Give over thine own willing, give over thine own running, give over thine own desiring to know or be anything and sink down to the seed which God sows in the hearts, and let that grow in thee and be in thee and breathe in thee and act in thee..."

Paul Mangelsdorf reported that the projection is that AFM will make the 2015 budget with funds to spare and reminded the meeting that those funds are needed for the planned capital improvements in 2016. The clerk and AFM thank Lynn Leuszler for a job well done as treasurer.

Administration Committee: On behalf of the Administration Committee Steve Collins reported that the Library Committee is still deciding about the new chairs and thanked Erica Schoon for conducting the silent auction which raised funds to offset the costs of the renovations. He then reminded the meeting that approximately \$40,000 is needed for the exterior painting, repairs and gutters. Steve then presented two minutes of appreciation.

- **Minute 12-20-2015-10:** *The Atlanta Friends Meeting expresses its heartfelt thanks to **Erica Schoon**, who has served so admirably as Friend in Residence for more than three years. She has been not only a welcoming presence in the Meetinghouse but active in and outside of the Meeting -- working on recycling initiatives, assisting with the Library renovation project (including coordination of the successful furniture auction), working with Peacebuilders Camp at Koinonia Farm, and building connections with Friends young and old. We will hold her in the Light as she continues her life journey.*
- **Minute 12-20-2015-11:** *When Nan O'Connor was asked to be clerk her initial reaction was a clear no, but she took time to talk with Friends and to discern her leading. She asked for support to take on this work and agreed to serve. Her experience and skills helped us make our meetings for worship with attention to business both worshipful and efficient. Quaker Voluntary Service: Liz Nicholson reported that the six current fellows have been active lately with a spiritual nurture dinner, holiday party and campfire singing, and various QVS days building fellowship. They greatly appreciate the support AFM has provided. They are currently seeking site placements for next year. Applications for new fellows are due in March so everyone is asked to spread the word to their young friends. Kiera McNicholas has realized that at this point in her life the structure of QVS does not fit her needs and is withdrawing from the program on January 5, 2016. Liz Nicholson read her letter thanking the meeting and explaining her decision.
