Many Quaker meetings welcome and affirm gender and sexual orientation diversity, though some Quaker meetings have not yet found clarity to do so.

What is Friends for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer Concerns?

We are a Quaker faith community. We deeply honor, affirm, and uphold that of the Divine in all people. We seek to know that of the Divine within ourselves and others, and seek to express this Truth as it is made known to us.

It is our hope to offer an oasis to those who have been spurned because of their sexual orientation and/or gender identity.

We are learning that **radical inclusion and radical love bring further light to Quaker testimony and life.**

We gather twice a year, at our mid-winter gathering in February and within the Summer Gathering of Friends General Conference (FGC is a North American Quaker body.) At these times we welcome newcomers, worship together, practice group decision-making guided by our discernment of Divine will, build community together, share our individual journeys, celebrate our lives, heal old wounds, and draw sustenance from the Spirit for our work and life in the world.

The following statement was made by the Central Committee of Friends General Conference (FGC) concerning orientation and gender identity:

“Our experience has been that spiritual gifts are not distributed with regard to sexual orientation or gender identity. Our experience has been that our [gatherings and committee] work has been immeasurably enriched over the years by the full participation and Spirit-guided leadership of gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, and queer Friends. We will never go back to silencing those voices or suppressing those gifts. Our experience confirms that we are all equal before God, as God made us, and we feel blessed to be engaged in the work of FGC together.”
