MINUTES FOR POPLAR RIDGE MONTHLY MEETING FOR BUSINESS

Minutes for the Aug. 19, 2018, Poplar Ridge Monthly Meeting.

The Monthly Meeting opened with a period of worship about 11:50 a.m.; the minutes from the July 15 meeting were read.

Attending were Larry Buffam, Phyllis Bunker, David Connelly, Barry Kahn, Dill Otis, Sally Otis, Hannah Richter, Andy Simkin, Jane Simkin, Linda Simkin, and, Paul Simkin.

- Larry and Andy of the Building and Grounds Committee reported that it is considering adding horizontal guards between the existing snow guards on the roof to prevent snow from sliding into ramp below. Additionally, they will begin siding with added insulation on the west wall of the south addition of the Meetinghouse, weather permitting.

From a conversation Larry had with Mike Farrell from the Rochester meeting on his meeting's experience with a lift, Larry submitted the following report and elaborated it. The meeting was pleased with the lift, Mike said. Before proceeding, Larry recommended contacting local providers and builders about costs. The lower priced lifts can handle just one or two standing people.

The Building and Grounds Committee will take into account our discussions, do additional research, and will report its recommendations and additional questions next Monthly Meeting.

Copies of the plans are available in the meetinghouse's library.

Summary of conversations re: accessibility at PRFM.

Larry's written report:

"1. I had a phone conversation with Mike Farrell from Rochester meeting. He has been taking care of the maintenance and oversight of the lift there for several years. Their lift has been in operation since

1999. Mike started by stating that he has been very impressed with the lift, it has been used regularly, usually multiple times a week and continues to serve them well. It requires 6 month maintenance visits in Rochester (cost about \$400 annually). The major issue has been user familiarity in that the lift will stop, unaligned with the floor, if the user starts to open the inner door before lift totally stopped. This requires someone outside the lift to go to the control panel and hit a reset. Rather a major problem but one that has been worked out with familiarity. Minimal maintenance issues over the 19 years, mostly having to do with the inner door which is an accordion style as in a rolltop desk (hinges coming undone).

"Mike talked about different makes and styles of lifts and advised research into locally available, locally servicable units for price, user satisfaction reviews, etc.

"2. I looked up lifts on line briefly. They come in a price range of \$20,000. -- \$50,000. installed. This is for either hydraulic or pneumatic lifts. We would probably be looking in the midrange, as the lower end would be smaller and not advisable for a wheelchair.

"3. I talked to Kathleen. She sent a further set of drawings to indicate another possibility for how the lift could work on the south side of the building. She is inclined to want to have the lift (and the regular entry) toward the southeast corner of the kitchen, believing that it would be best to dedicate the west end of the kitchen space to kitchen and, upstairs, to leave the library intact.

"More research needed I believe."

- Ruth Bradley sent a note saying there are no significant changes since last month

- About Fall Gathering at our Meetinghouse on Sept. 15, food for the day will be organized by the Social Committee

- A committee from New York Yearly Meeting considering Rebecca's request to be a recorded minister will be here worshipping with us on Sunday after Fall Gathering. We are invited to meet with the committee to share our experiences of Rebecca's ministry amongst us. We will meet with the committee after the rise of worship on

Sunday.

- We will move our next Business Meeting to Sept. 9, a week before our regular date due to the Sept. 16 conflict.
- Andy is donating four folding tables that are lighter and safer than the tables we have, and we decided to buy two additional tables for about \$260 total from the General Fund. He will take away our older, heavier tables.
- We approved Christopher Sammond's request to update his travel minute. It will be approved by the Farmington Scipio Regional Meeting and New York Yearly Meeting.

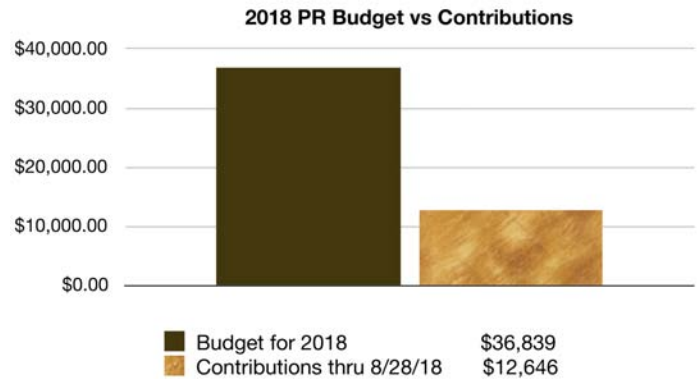
